Her clinical and research interests center on defining best practice ABA techniques, on evaluating the impact of ABA in learners with autism, in training staff to be optimally effective at instruction, and in maximizing family members' expertise and adaptation. She received her Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology from Rutgers University and has written numerous articles and four books on autism.
